She improved her basso continuo at the *Pontificio Istituto di Musica Sacra* and graduated as Harpsichord Maestro at Santa Cecilia Musci Academy.



She is concert performer and harpsichordist in the regional orchestra of Rome and Lazio and collaborates mainly with the soloists of the Accademia of Santa Cecilia, *Orchestra Trinità de' Monti, Schola Romana Ensemble, Musica Antiqua Latina* and *Accademia per Musica*.

She has performed in France, Germany, Austria, Switzerland, Croatia, Hungary, Lithuania, Argentina and Italy for various institutions (*Festival delle Nazioni, Festival Barocco di Viterbo, Gonfalone, Festival Euro Mediterraneo, Festival de Musique Ancienne de Callas, Segni Barocchi Festival, la Stravaganza, Internationale Händel-FestspieleGöttingen...*).

Cecilia has recorded various CDs (Bach's Sonate for bass-viol and cembalo obbligato, Karl Friedrich's Abel, English music etc..) and recorded for Hungarian and Lithuanian Radiotelevision as well as for NDR Nord-Deutscher-Rundfunk.
